We are planning an inaugural Dinner Dance in 2018. Stay tuned for more information.

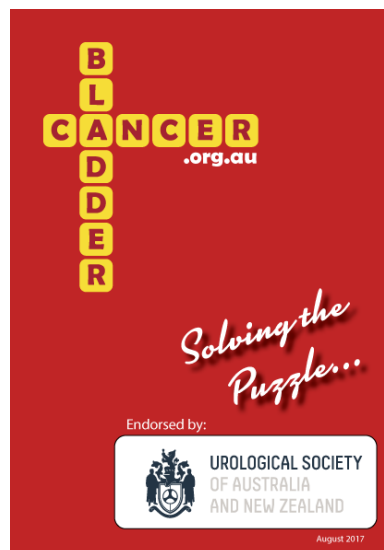
